Course Description

Welcome to the wonderful world of Photography! This is an introductory course in which you will become familiar with the camera as an expressive art tool. You will learn to plan and produce photographic images that reflect an understanding of composition, lighting, the limits of the camera, and basic and experimental laboratory processes. You will be encouraged to explore the myriad of possibilities which photography has to offer.

Objectives

- 1. Operate a 35mm camera as a means toward creative self-expression.
- 2. Develop black & white film, make contact sheets, and produce 5×7 " and 8×10 " prints.
- 3. Professionally finish, mount, and present your artwork.
- 4. Develop critical thinking and assessment skills & gain meaningful access to cultural capital.

- 1. 35mm camera (see 35mm Camera Requirements handout for more info)
- 2. 2" binder
- 3. Clear 8 x 10" sheet protectors (50 pack)
- 4. Flash drive
- 5. Film & photo paper (purchased through Ballard, details on next sheet)
